

# Some Great Hikes in and Around Sedona

A [Red Rock Pass](#) (or **America The Beautiful Interagency Pass**, Golden Age or Golden Access) is required when leaving your vehicle unattended while hiking on National Forest land around Sedona and Oak Creek Canyon. The pass must be displayed in the windshield of your vehicle or your vehicle will be subject to citation. A pass is not required for incidental stopping to take a photograph or enjoy a scenic vista (approximately 15 minutes or less).

## **Bell Rock (Moderate)**



A 4.3 mile round trip hike between Bell Rock and Courthouse Butte with spectacular views. From the parking area off of SR 179, follow the Bell Rock Pathway Trail north and turn right and follow the Courthouse Butte Loop Trail. Head left on to an unmarked trail and follow it between Bell Rock and Courthouse Butte until you intersect the north side of the Courthouse Butte Loop Trail.

## **Coffee Pot Rock (Easy)**



This easy in-town hike takes you to the base of Coffeepot Rock. It is 2.4 miles round trip and begins at a parking area off of Buena Vista (the same parking area for the Teacup and Sugarloaf Trails). Follow the Teacup Trail until you intersect the unmarked Coffeepot Trail.

## **Doe Mountain (Moderate)**



This 2.6 mile round trip trail circles around the top of Doe Mountain. The hike up the mountain is relatively steep and the views are excellent. The parking area is located on Boynton Pass Road and serves the Doe Mountain and Bear Mountain hikes.

## **Fay Canyon (Easy to Moderate)**



A relatively short, relaxed hike through a scenic canyon. The Fay Canyon trail is About 1 1/4 miles each way, 2 1/2 miles round trip. The parking area is located on Boynton Pass Road. The trailhead is across the road from the parking area.

## **Midgley Bridge (Easy to Moderate)**



This is a relatively short (.5 mile or less), easy hike down into scenic Oak Creek Canyon, but the return trip is a bit more strenuous. Begin at the Midgley Bridge parking area and take time to view the scenic overlook. This is a great area to swim and picnic—it is far less crowded than nearby Slide Rock.
